Information Pack

What is a Home Educator day?

These special events are a great opportunity for Home Educator families to visit the museum at a quieter time (we don't take any school bookings on this day) and to take part in some of our school programmes and other activities.

How much does it cost?

- Children aged 5 years + **£12**
- Children aged 3-4 years **£6**
- Children aged 1-2 years **£3**
- Children aged under 1 years **FREE**
- **One FREE adult** for every paying child aged 5-11yrs
- Additional adults **£6**

To book on to the Home Educator Day you must have at least one paying child aged 5 years or over.

What is included in the price?

- Full access to the museum galleries
- Additional bookable activities for children aged **5yrs+**
- Complimentary drinks voucher for the café
- 10% discount in the Gift Shop all day (only available on 11 May and to booked HE families)
- 10% discount off the Annual Pass. *NB: this must be purchased before 3pm on the day*

What isn't included?

- Car parking. We have a pay and display car park which is £3.40 for up to 4 hours or £6.80 for the day. Our car park machines now accept contactless card payment as well as coins so please purchase your ticket before entering the museum. **Blue badge holders can park free of charge**, and we've got designated blue badge spaces outside of the museum and in the rear car park.
- Lunch. You are welcome to bring a packed lunch, or we do have a café on site serving a selection of snacks, meals and refreshments which is open from 10am – 3.45pm (serving hot food from 11am – 2.30pm)

I'm already an Annual Pass holder, can I use it on Home Educator day?

Yes! Existing Annual Pass holders receive discounted tickets to the event:

- Children aged 5 years + **£8**
- Children aged 3-4 years **FREE**
- Children aged 1-2 years **FREE**
- Children aged under 1 years **FREE**
- Adults **FREE**

To receive this discount, you must book in advance as it cannot be redeemed on the day. You will need your member number to hand when booking. Only those visiting who hold a valid annual pass are entitled to the above discount.

I'm not already an Annual Pass holder, can I get one?

You can purchase an Annual Pass on the Home Educator Day. There will be a special offer available of a 10% discount (**available until 3pm**).

Children aged 1 – 2	£6.45	£5.80
Children aged 3 and over and adults	£14.95	£13.45

What age range is it suitable for?

As this special event is for Home Educator families the main target age group is children of primary school age (5-11yrs) and the additional activities available on the day will be designed for this age group.

Children aged 3 years and over will still get lots out of the museum galleries and we do have two galleries which are just for the under 5s.

If you have children of varying ages then, if possible, we would suggest that at least two adults attend the day so that very young children don't have to attend a session which isn't suitable for their age range. You can bring one free adult with every paying child aged 5-11yrs and additional adults are £6 each.

Will the museum be open to non-Home Educator families too?

Yes, but we are limiting the number of general public tickets available on this day, and we don't take any school or group bookings.

We'd love to make our Home Educator days completely exclusive events but as an educational charity that relies solely on visitor income, we wouldn't be able to do this and offer such discounted tickets for Home Ed families at the same time.

Do we get a guided tour as part of the visit?

Our team of Enablers are placed in key areas around the museum to help support families with playful learning, but we don't offer guided tours. We encourage children to take the lead and discover for themselves. Some will play and explore in one area for hours while others will quickly move from one place to another.

Can I bring my younger children?

Siblings aged 2 and under may accompany older siblings at no additional cost. Whilst areas of the museum are suitable for under 5s, please note that the Home Educator Day does not include sessions specifically for very young children and in order to be eligible to make a booking on this special event, **you must have at least one child aged 5yrs in your party.**

If you plan to visit with children of various ages then, if possible, we suggest you bring an additional adult to help supervise. You are responsible for the supervision and conduct of your children **at all times**. It is important that children are **never** left unattended or allowed to wander around the building alone.

Children will not be permitted into workshops or other activities if they are not supervised by an adult.

How do we book?

We are unable to take bookings over the phone.

Payment must be made at the time of booking and if you are an existing Annual Pass holder, you'll need your Member Number too.

Bookings will close at **4pm** on Friday 6 May 2022 (or earlier if capacity is reached)

Cancellation policy

If you cancel within **1 week** of the Home Educator day, Eureka! will charge **50%** of the total cost of your visit.

No refunds will be given if you cancel on the day of the event or simply don't show up. Cancellations must be sent in writing via email.

How do we get there?

Directions to Eureka! can be found at <https://www.eureka.org.uk/visit-us/find-us/> but we are clearly signposted from both Junction 24 and 26 of the M62 and there is a pay & display car park.

We are also right next door to Halifax Railway Station with regular services from Leeds and Manchester, and just a 5min walk from Halifax Bus Station.

Should we bring lunch?

There are picnic areas available both inside and outside the museum should you wish to bring a packed lunch. We also have a café on site serving a selection of snacks, meals and refreshments which will be open from 10am – 3.45pm (serving hot food between 11am – 2.30pm).

What time should we arrive?

The museum will be open **10am – 4pm** and you are welcome to arrive at any time.

If you have booked a session, then you should aim to arrive at least 15mins before your chosen session time. If you are late for your chosen session slot, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to fit you into a later session.

There will be a registration desk in the entrance foyer where staff will be ready to meet you and provide you with a schedule of the day's activities.

Will there be somewhere to store our things?

Coats can be left in the cloakroom in the SoundSpace gallery. Unfortunately we're no longer able to provide lockers for large items. **Please note:** All items are left at owner's risk, therefore, please keep any valuables with you.

Do you cater for families with disabled children?

Eureka! is very proud to be an accessible venue and to provide facilities and services for our disabled visitors to assist and support you during your visit. Activities available – Wednesday 11 May 2022

As well as the activities outlined below, there are 4 large galleries for you to explore (plus 2 galleries just for the under 5s) with tons of hands-on exhibits. Visit our [website](#) to find out more:

1. Bookable science show - choose a show slot at the time of booking

From the Chew to the Poo science show

Times: 30min sessions at 10.30am, 11am, 11.30am, 12pm, 1pm, 1.30pm, 2pm, 2.30pm

Age range: 5yrs and over

Follow the amazing journey of a banana sandwich from the first moment it's chewed to the last moment it's pooped, learning about the digestive system and the importance of a healthy, well-balanced diet along the way.

2. Drop-in sessions:

Tote bag making

Times: 10.30am – 3.30pm

Age range: 5yrs and over

Use chromatography art to design your own tote bag to take home. Additional cost of £1 to cover cost of materials.

Genomics

Times: 10.30am – 3.30pm

Age range: 5yrs and over

Hands-on activities about DNA and genomics. Come and see for yourself if you've inherited the gene that means you don't like sprouts, make your own alien by deciding what they inherit from their parents, and extract the DNA from a strawberry!
